Matt Bailey

Mr. Bailey is not only a marketing analyst and media research consultant, he is an adult with albinism. As a young person, he found an innovative solution to answer the most common question people with albinism encounter.

Mr. Bailey's "How We See" presentation was so popular at NOAH National Conferences that it was adapted for NOAH's webinar series – the most popular

webinar to date. He has also served on NOAH's Board of Directors (2000 - 2006) and helped organize the 2004 NOAH National Conference in Atlanta. He and his wife Meliké (who also has albinism), live in Chapel Hill, NC, along with their daughter Anna.

C. Gail Summers, M.D.

Dr. Gail Summers is a professor in the Departments of Ophthalmology and Pediatrics at the University of Minnesota in Minneapolis and a Director of the International Albinism Center Research Team. She is a Fellow of the American Academy of Ophthalmology, a Specialty Fellow of the American Academy of Pediatrics Section on Ophthalmology, vice president of the



American Association for Pediatric Ophthalmology and Strabismus, and a member of the American Ophthalmological Society, the Minnesota Academy of Ophthalmology and Women in Ophthalmology. Dr. Summers has received numerous honors and awards throughout her career, and has been a member of NOAH's Board of Scientific Advisors since 1990. Dr. Summers' current interests include fellow, resident and orthoptist education; clinical and surgical pediatric ophthalmology and strabismus, with special interest in genetic eye diseases; and research relative to the prevention and management of retinopathy of prematurity and visual function in albinism.

Tracy Matchinski, O.D., FAAO

Assistant Professor of Optometry, Illinois College of Optometry. Dr. Matchinski is a Low Vision diplomate of the American Academy of Optometry and has lectured both nationally and internationally on Low Vision Rehabilitation.

She is a chapter author in the low vision textbook Essentials of Low Vision Practice, and she is involved in several research projects including portable electronic magnifiers and the National Eye Institute EP Hemianopic Lens multi-center clinical trial. Dr. Matchinski is currently Chief of Low Vision Rehabilitation Service at the Illinois Eye Institute and the Low Vision class coordinator for third year optometry students. Dr. Matchinski splits her time between the Chicago Lighthouse for People who are Blind or Visually Impaired and the Low Vision Rehabilitation Services at the Illinois Eye Institute. She has been practicing low vision care for 11 years and has a special interest in pediatric low vision rehabilitation. She also is president-elect of Illinois Volunteer Optometric Services to Humanity and an active member on volunteer missions providing eye care, glasses and low vision devices.
